



Student code of conduct

Dear Participant, we are looking forward to welcoming you to the international camp: Fun, Friendship and Thinking. We kindly ask you to observe the following rules to allow all the participants to make the most of the online sessions.

Before the class:

1. Prepare your working place in advance. It is best to use a laptop or a PC, a tablet may be ok (and may even be good if you can write on it) but please avoid joining the sessions from your phone.
2. Make sure you print the list of questions or have it open on another device.
3. Have pen and paper ready!
4. Have a comfortable place to write, such as a table.
5. Be prepared to meet students that speak different languages. Be aware of cultural differences. If you are interested in languages learn a few words in English, Japanese, German and Welsh! Students from other countries will appreciate it.
6. Do not panic! You may not understand everything in the sessions, but you will learn plenty of interesting maths. You will receive solutions after each class.
7. It is an expectation that students in the camp will be using a camera and a microphone to create a friendly atmosphere in class. If you are in a rural area with slow broadband, switching off your video may improve your speed.
8. Join the class appropriately dressed (as you would for school) and from an appropriate place. Consider what will be visible in your camera. Having a white wall as a background is a good option.
9. You will be given time to work on questions in small groups. Participants will be encouraged to talk about their solutions.

In class:

1. Login 10 min in advance. You will be taken into a waiting room.
2. Once in the waiting room, please rename yourself as explained in the email.
3. Have pen and paper ready and questions printed.
4. Do not play with the features of the online room. Always follow lecturers' instructions.
5. Switch off your microphone every time you finish talking, to minimise the noise.
6. It is an expectation that students in the camp will be using a camera and a microphone to create a friendly atmosphere in class, however please consider your broadband connection and check with your parents/guardians.
7. Be polite to other people and be understanding about cultural differences.
8. Use the chat box or your microphone to ask and answer questions.
9. Do not panic! Ask for help in the chat or email your local organiser. If we do not react immediately, please wait. We are working on it and will come back to you as soon as we can.
10. Do not interrupt the lecturers or other students presenting.
11. Do not share your personal details with anyone in the session.
