## **02 EUCS** – Study Rules

- Study and Exam Regulations:
  - General Study Rules = Rahmenprüfungsordnung (RaPO)
  - Generic rules about courses and exams that apply to almost the entire university
  - Ex. Recognition of courses, examination board, recognition of special needs, plagiarism and cheating and all other examination rules...
  - Specific Study Rules = Prüfungs- und Studienordnung (PStO)
  - These rules apply to EUCS only Specific requirements to complete EUCS






