DFG Antragswerkstatt für Wissenschaftler*innen in der Bildungs- und/oder Europaforschung ICES/ZeBUSS Project Grant Proposal Workshop/ First session: 18.10.2024

The DFG Project Grant (Sachbeihilfe) is Germany's most popular topic-open funding format for basic research. Are you considering to submit a Sachbeihilfe proposal or are already working on it, then our DFG Antragswerkstatt in Autumn Semester 2024/25 can support you along your way to submitting the proposal! This workshop, organized by ICES and ZeBUSS, is designed for post-doctoral researchers and professors, aiming to complete a DFG proposal over the course of the semester.

Participants will meet every 3-4 weeks for 1 hour via Webex, forming interdisciplinary or subject-specific groups of 2-3 people. Each session will cover one or more different chapters in the proposal template, with a brief input from Simone Onur and Maria Schwab followed by a peer-to-peer discussion of the participants' proposal

sections. Between sessions, participants will write the designated proposal section and share it a few days before the next meeting for peer review.

Applications must come from the target countries, and projects are developed in consultation with the foundation.

DFG: Standing Open Proposal Submission Opportunities in the individual grants programme

The Deutsche Forschungsgemeinschaft (DFG) maintains agreements with funding organizations across Europe and worldwide to facilitate transnational research activities. In addition to fixed proposal deadlines, some agreements offer Standing Open Procedures, allowing submissions at any time.

These are available with partners in countries including Austria, Belgium, Czech Republic, Luxembourg, Poland, Switzerland, and Italy (Bolzano, South Tyrol).

Globally, the DFG has agreements with partners in Brazil, Colombia, India, Turkey, and the USA (in selected fields). Applications must be submitted in parallel to the DFG and the respective partner organization. Only projects positively assessed by both organizations will be funded. [Further information](#).

Fellows will receive a stipend of approximately \$8,000 to cover research expenses, publication, or other related costs.

The goal is to promote suitable infrastructures for Open Access publishing and enhance the structural conditions of the scientific publishing system. Eligible to apply are researchers and staff of non-profit scientific information infrastructure institutions (such as libraries, archives, and museums). Over a four-year period, it funds activities like workshops, training schools, and publications, while research personnel and project costs are covered through national funding. COST particularly encourages the inclusion of younger researchers and those from Inclusiveness Targeted Countries.
