## Dr. Samantha Litty (ICES and Frisian Department) receives DFG Individual Research Grant to begin 2023

Dr. Samantha Litty (ICES und Friesisches Seminar ) wird DFG Eigene Stelle Förderungen bewilligt

Dr. Samantha Litty has been granted a DFG Individual Research Grant with a project entitled, "Visibilizing Normative Regional Historical Multilingualism (ViNoRHM): Ideology, Policy, and Practice." The project will begin in 2023 and continue through January 2026. The ViNoRHM project will research the languages used historically in the Duchy of Schleswig, an administratively and geographically bounded region of quintolingualism. By setting the language practices of individuals and communities as the foundation of ViNoRHM, both previously invisible or invisibilized languages and individuals (especially women and the un-/lesser educated) are brought to the forefront. ## BMBF continues and expands the funding for the European Wasatia Graduate School

Wir gratulieren Prof. Dr. Ralf Wüstenberg, Zeina Barakat und ihrem Team zu diesem großartigen Erfolg

The Parliamentary Budget Committee has decided to fund the "European Wasatia Graduate School for Peace and Conflict Resolution" at EUF with a total of approximately 2.1 million euros. The Graduate School seeks to initiate a process of reconciliation. It is a PhD-Programme which creates an interdisciplinary framework for dialogical understanding of the structural nature of conflict and the development of sustainable conflict resolution strategies. The school was founded in November 2021 and hosts currently twelve doctoral students. With the BMBF funding it is ensured that beyond the currently enrolled doctoral students, two additional cohorts can be admitted and funded in 2023 and in 2026. In addition to Israelis, Palestinians and Germans, scholarships will also go to young doctoral students from other transition societies, such as South Africa, Ireland, Albania, among others. We provide grants for Early Stage Researchers at EUF as well as associated ICES members who plan to conduct field research or archive/library stays. Like last semester, the "Field Research Call" will be combined with a funding opportunity to participate in European Studies-specific training courses (online or face-to-face). We can fund stays for research or qualification purposes of generally up to 1.000 euros each. They should take place in autumn semester 2022/23 or spring semester 2023. Please provide an application (max. 1 page), including a short description of your research project respectively the training program you plan to attend, the necessity for and details about your intended stay, preliminary timeframe, and a budget plan. Applications can be submitted in German or English. We give priority to ICES Research School members when awarding the grants. We look forward to receiving your proposal. Zuwendungszweck ist es, systematische Forschungsaktivitäten zur Wissenschaftskommunikation in wissenschaftlich und gesellschaftlich relevanten Themenbereichen anzuregen, damit einen Beitrag zum wissenschaftlichen und gesicherten Erkenntnisgewinn zu Fragen der Wissenschaftskommunikation zu leisten und das Feld der Wissenschaftskommunikationsforschung in Deutschland fächerübergreifend und nachhaltig zu stärken. Die Universität Augsburg, das Forum Interkulturelles Leben und Lernen (FiLL e.V.) und die Friedensstadt Augsburg verleihen gemeinsam den Augsburger Wissenschaftspreis für interkulturelle Studien. Die Ausschreibung wendet sich an alle wissenschaftlichen Disziplinen und prämiert interdisziplinär und innovativ angelegte Qualifikationsarbeiten. Eingereicht werden können wissenschaftliche Qualifikationsarbeiten, die nicht länger als zwei Jahre vor dem jeweils aktuellen Bewerbungsschluss an einer deutschen Universität vorgelegt wurden. Der mit 5.000 Euro dotierte Hauptpreis wird für Dissertationen oder Habilitationsschriften vergeben, der Förderpreis in Höhe von 1.500 Euro für Master-, Diplom-, Magister- oder Staatsexamens-Arbeiten. Citizen science plays an important role in encouraging public engagement with research and tackling real-world problems. Research involving citizens and allowing them to gain more insight into the scientific process can lead to more trust in science in general. Also, our environmental, health, social, economic and political challenges require scientists, citizens, policymakers, and in general, a broader range of stakeholders, to find new ways of collaborating with each other. ## CfP: Changing concepts of “Europe” since the 18<sup>th</sup> century: Between the national, the transnational, and the global / Deadline: 10.01.2023

*CfP: Workshop in Aarhus zum Thema “sich wandelnde Vorstellungen von Europa” / Frist: 10.01.2022*

Discourses on “Europe” reach far back in time. In the course of this development, various understandings of Europe and European identity have emerged, which may still be drawn upon in current discourses and which often overlap, permeate or even contradict each other. The aim of the workshop is to investigate changing concepts of Europe from the 18th century to the present and to ask how the cultural, social, spatial and historical dimensions of “Europe” have been and are imagined in relation to the national and the global. Contributions may focus on a wide variety of media in various modes, e.g. linguistic, visual or aural, and may refer to dictionaries, encyclopaedias, textbooks, educational media, print media, literature, works of art, popular culture, journals and magazines, among others. Papers dealing with questions of transition, change, rupture as well as of continuity and stability of knowledge are particularly welcome. More information can be found [here](#).

## EU: Revised State Aid Framework Adopted

*EU: Überarbeiteter Rahmen für staatliche Beihilfe verabschiedet*

The European Commission has adopted a revised version of the State Aid Framework for research, development and innovation on 19 October 2022. This framework defines the rules under which EU Member States can award state aid for research, development and innovation activities to companies. The now published update of the State Aid Framework is based on the results of an evaluation, which has been ongoing since 2019, as well as of stakeholder consultations. Furthermore, the Commission has aligned the rules of the State Aid Framework with its current policy priorities such as the European Green Deal and the New European Research Area. ## EU: New guidance document on lump sums

The European Commission has published a new guide to lump sum projects in Horizon Europe on the Funding & Tenders Opportunities Portal. The document summarises the most important information on how to apply for, evaluate and implement these projects. In lump sum projects, reimbursement is not based on actual costs, but on lump sums for completed work packages of the project. The Horizon Europe Work Programme 2023/2024, to be published at the end of November this year, foresees that a large part of the calls for proposal (about 20% of the budget) will be implemented through lump sum funding.
